Frequently Asked Questions

Is there any cost for me to participate in MAGIC Summer Camp?

The camp is FREE to any High School girl that registers. However, the camp can only accommodate 20 participants. The Puget Sound Chapter of the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) and Industry Sponsors cover cost of camp.

When and where is Summer Camp scheduled?

MAGIC Summer Camp will be offered at Western Washington Sheet Metal JATC in Everett (11831 Beverly Park Rd, Bldg B, Everett, WA 98204) from Monday through Wednesday June 27-29th, 2011.

What will I learn?

Daily activities include learning the basics of safety, carpentry, electrical and welding. Camp will also feature women working in various jobs in the construction industry.

Will I need to provide my own tools, etc?

No. All tools and materials required for camp will be provided by NAWIC and camp sponsors.

Will MAGIC Summer Camp be like regular school?

Although there will be some class time to meet special guests involved in the construction industry, camp is designed to be a hands-on experience and requires that participants learn by doing!

Is transportation to and from Camp provided?

No. Camp participants are required to provide their own transportation to and from Camp each day.

MAGIC Summer Camp Information and Rules

- Safety** The National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) and Western Washington Sheet Metal JATC consider safety a core principle of MAGIC Summer Camp. Any camper that disregards safety rules and procedures may be asked to leave the program.
- Dress Code** Campers must abide by the dress code of the construction industry ~ long pants, shirts or t-shirts, and closed-toed shoes. (leather tennis shoes, hiking boots etc.) No dangling jewelry please (anything that can become caught in a tool is not allowed.)
- Conduct** All rules of Western Washington Sheet Metal JATC will apply. Campers who disrespect fellow campers, guest instructors, or instructors will be asked to leave. No profanity or smoking is allowed.
- Schedule/
Transportation** Camp begins promptly at each day. (Generally 8:30 to 4:30 pm) Campers must be on time. All campers are responsible for transportation to and from camp each day.
- Meals** Morning break and lunch will be provided for campers each day. A dessert reception will take place Friday afternoon. (Remember to invite your parents).
- Water/
Hydration** A cooler filled with bottled water will be available for you to use throughout each day. Please drink it. Dehydration is an important safety issue in construction during the hot months of summer.
